- Managed retention of participants (>90%)
- Conducted structured diagnostic psychological interviews with study participants under the supervision of a licensed psychologist
- Collaborated with study biostatistician to execute randomization process and analysis of study results; responsible for data management using web-based data capture
- Worked with multidisciplinary quality improvement team to implement screening measures and educational tools in pediatric gastroenterology practice (over 20,000 screenings administered)
- Prepared several manuscripts for publication in peer reviewed journals
